




Using Google Chrome:






Using Mozilla Firefox:





3. Check your exam environment is appropriate

Your exam room

- Is clearly lit to allow clear video capture.
- Is isolated from distractions and interruptions.

Your desk

- Is clear of papers, books, printed material, pens and pencils.
- You are NOT allowed to write notes on paper during the exam.
- Is free of any kind of devices other than your computer and its peripherals.
- You are allowed to have a glass/bottle of water on your desk.

4. Check you are ready to start the exam

Your PC/Laptop

- Close all browsers (except for the one being used for the exam) & files
- Use the WC before starting the exam because you cannot leave your desk once you have started the exam.

Have to hand

- Personal ID to show to the camera for verification by the invigilator. Use your passport as it normally has a better quality photograph.
- IMPORTANT: You can ONLY access the exam on the date and at the time of your exam session. Once the exam session closes you will NOT be able to enter the exam.

Use the link provided to start your exam. The exam link will open at the agreed time, and you have 30 minutes to access the assessment platform. A waiting time of 15 to 20 minutes to complete the identification process to start the exam is normal. Please be patient, your examination time will only start counting after the verification is completed and you click the "start exam" button.

When filling in your details make sure you use the same email address used to receive your exam ticket.

5. Troubleshooting Plugins, Spell Checkers, or Extensions

If you are experiencing problems with plugins, spell checkers, or extensions on your computer, you can follow the general steps below to troubleshoot the issue.

1.Disabling Plugins:

- Open your web browser (e.g., Chrome, Firefox, Safari).
- Look for the menu icon (three dots, three lines, etc.) typically located in the top-right corner of the browser window.
- Access the browser's settings or preferences.
- Navigate to the "Extensions" or "Add-ons" section.
- Locate the plugin(s) causing the issue.
- Disable or remove the problematic plugin(s) by toggling the switch or clicking on the corresponding option.

7. The Mock Exam

What is the mock exam?

The mock exam is an opportunity to experience the online exam platform by doing a mini version of the CESGA exam. It has 5 Multiple Choice Questions and an example open question from a Case Study. The mock will not be corrected or invigilated.

What is the purpose of the mock exam?

You will go through the log in process where you photograph your ID with your computer camera as explained in section 5 to this Guide. You can also practise navigating forwards and backwards through the mock exam paper which will be the same way you navigate through the real online exam. Monitor the exam time remaining. See exam section to this Guide.

Please note that in previous exam sessions ALL the candidates who had technical problems were those who had not used the mock exam to test their computer set up beforehand or were using the Safari browser. We encourage you to do the mock and chose an alternative browser for the exam.

How long is the Mock exam?

The mock exam is only 10 minutes long.

When can I do the mock exam?

Candidates will receive an email with a link to the Mock exam. The mock exam will be open for a period of 72 hours. Please use this opportunity! There will only be ONE opportunity to do the mock exam per exam session. If you miss it we are not able to offer you another mock exam.




